### Where it all started

Read With Me was founded by Linda Cohen in 2020, amidst the Covid pandemic and changing educational landscape, with one clear mission: to help every child in Gloucestershire learn to read well.

Linda had begun to understand, through work in Somerset, the terrible **disadvantage** that **not being heard to read or read to at home** can deliver to our children. The statistics below demonstrate that, even before the pandemic, the UK was facing **a children's literacy crisis.**

Of course, Covid made everything even harder for schools, parents and children. With this in mind, **Read With Me** was created to alleviate some of the pressure on schools by providing pupils with much needed **one-to-one reading time.** 

These sessions were designed not only to improve pupils' **literacy skills** but also to build their **confidence** and **communication skills**, both vital in order for them to reach their **full potential.** 

Providing **one-to-one** reading sessions, twice a week, is a simple intervention that ensures the futures of our talented children aren't written or indeed written off by the **age of 7**.

#### Where we are now

We now have over 250 volunteers and work with schools across the county. We hear thousands of children read every week and we have seen outstanding results.

#### **Case study:**

In a Year 1 class where only **45%** were achieving the expected standard in Reception.





## The importance of our reading sessions, and our reading volunteers, cannot be overstated.

Alongside our reading sessions, we now offer **Not So Secret Book Clubs** during the school holidays, **Rhyme With Me** sessions for younger children and their parents, as well as after-school support. Our services are always **free at the point of access**; we believe that fostering a love for reading shouldn't cost the earth. That's why we give away thousands of pre-loved books during the school holidays at our **Not So Secret Book Clubs**.

### Where we're going

#### Read With Me is perfectly positioned to bridge the gap in the children's literacy crisis.

Over the past three years we have made significant progress, but our journey is **far from over.** We are being contacted **every day** by schools in Gloucestershire who need our help. By becoming a **Read With Me volunteer** you are helping to give the children in your community the future they deserve – and we are sure you will **have fun** taking part too!



#### **Read With Me**

As a **non-profit organisation**, we are only able to offer our service thanks to the **generosity** of others. Everything we do is in the interest of the **children** we work with and the **wider community.** 

Due to our small but mighty team, we can provide excellent **value for money**. It costs us just **£50** to hear a child read, twice a week, for an **entire year**. That's less than **£5 a month** – the cost of a coffee and pastry on your way to work. So, where does this money come from?

#### **Our funding**

## We're lucky enough to receive external funding from our partners, local businesses and individuals like you.

We are incredibly thankful to have the support of brilliant organisations, like **Gloucestershire Gateway Trust**, who provide us with financial support as well as guidance. Our **corporate volunteer scheme** allows employees to spend their volunteer hours hearing children read, as well as organising fundraising events. We also receive regular donations from generous individuals as part of our **Gift of Reading** scheme. ### **Volunteering with us**

#### What to expect

Now you know who we are and what we do, we'd like to let you know what **you can expect** as a **Read With Me volunteer** and also what is **expected of you.** 

Our **Volunteer Liaison Manager** will provide all the information you need before your first session. After that, you will receive a **weekly newsletter**, including a **timetable** every **Wednesday** with all the information you need for the upcoming week. You'll also take part in an **induction** which will be carried out by one of our team members – this session will answer any additional questions you have about the logistics of volunteering and what to expect at school.



Your **volunteer pack** will include all the essentials: lanyard, pens, phonics sheets, bookmarks and most importantly – stickers! If you need anything **topped up** at any point then just let one of our **Volunteer Co-ordinators** or **Volunteer Liaison Manager** know.

### Volunteering with us

Every child is unique and there is no 'right' way to approach each session. However, we have compiled some handy tips and tricks to help you find your feet during your first few sessions:

Enthuse – Children are more likely to develop a love of reading if they feel excited about what they are reading. Take a look at the front cover together – what might the story be about? Have they read a little of the story already? Can they tell you what has happened so far? Are they enjoying the book, can they tell you why?

**Recap** – It is important to check that the children **understand what they are reading**; it's a good idea to ask them to **recap** what has just happened in the **last page** or **paragraph**. Can they **summarise** it for you? Were there any words they struggled with, do they know what it means? Can they think of any similar words? Or words that mean the opposite?

**Repeat** – Developing **expression** is **crucial** when creating **confident** and **fluent** readers. Try and read sentences back to the reader and ask them to repeat it with **enthusiasm** or **feeling.** You can also talk about how characters might be feeling when reading speech. What would they sound like? Can they change their voice slightly to help add more expression?



**Bonus tip:** In order to boost reading confidence and enjoyment, always try to find something **positive** to say at the end of the session – you will be really surprised how far a '**you tried really hard today'** goes!


### **Volunteering with us**

Our volunteers tell us that the best part of being a Read With Me volunteer is getting to know each child individually and working out which approach works best for them. But don't just take our word for it:

"I love getting to know the children and having time to chat with them as well as hear them read. The class teacher is so pleased that I do that as they don't always have the time to chat, discuss and widen the children's knowledge of what they are reading about. Or find out what the child already knows and what they are really interested in!"

In order for you and the children to **get the most** out of our sessions, we ask that you're **committed to volunteering** with us for **at least 12 months**. This will provide ample time for you to get to know each child and see their confidence grow from term to term.



We are partnered with some brilliant **independent bookshops** across Gloucestershire, that provide us with reviews and recommendations of the latest children's books.

#### **Policies and Procedures**

As with any new experience, there are a few things you will need to do to make sure you're **ready for your first session.** You'll need to familiarise yourself with **phonics** – don't worry, we'll provide all the resources you need, including a **video** you can refer back to it at any time. We understand that phonics can be a bit tricky to get to grips with at first, so we've made it as **simple as possible** by having the children teach you themselves! And remember, our **Training Manager** is always on hand if you encounter any issues.

As well as completing our **online safeguarding course**, it's really important that you familiarise yourself with our **Safeguarding Policy**. This will be sent to you along with our **Equal Opportunities Policy**, **Code of Conduct** and **Volunteer Agreement**. Make sure you have read these documents carefully and once you're happy, sign them and return them to us. We want **Read With Me** to be an **inclusive and happy place for everyone** involved; this means adhering to our policies and procedures which are designed to keep you, and everyone else, **safe**.

All of our partner schools have a **Health & Safety Policy** which will be made available to you, including instructions for emergency procedures (e.g., fire alarm, evacuation) and any safety aspects associated with particular tasks. Again, if you are **unsure about anything** or **have any concerns**, then please do not hesitate to **speak to a Volunteer Co-ordinator** or our **Volunteer Liaison Manager.** We want our volunteers to feel confident that they are equipped with the information they need to be the best volunteer they can be.

#### Who to speak to

We are incredibly **proud of the partnerships** we have cultivated with our partner schools and want to ensure that they are maintained in the future. To minimise any issues, we ask that **your first line of communication is always with the Read With Me team.** Please **do not contact schools directly** with queries or if you're unable to attend a session, just let our **Volunteer Liaison Manager** know with as much notice as possible – we'll try our best to keep the session running as expected.

The **safety** and **wellbeing** of our volunteers and the children they interact with is something we take **very seriously.** All our volunteers work under the **supervision** of a teacher or full-time member of staff. Teachers retain **ultimate responsibility** for **pupils at all times,** including the pupils' behaviour and the activities they are undertaking. If you have any concerns about being left unsupervised then do **get in touch.** 



If you encounter any issues with a pupil/teacher/staff member/volunteer then please let a **senior Read With Me team member know as soon as possible**.

If you have a concern regarding safeguarding then this should be discussed with the **Designated** Safeguarding Lead and then reported to our Volunteer Liaison Manager and NOT discussed with the parents of the child.


#### Some things to remember:

- Please turn your phone off whilst you're in school keep it out of sight, especially when with the children.
- Aside from bookmarks, stickers and other reading related gifts, please **don't give personal gifts** to the children you read with. It may encourage favouritism and set unrealistic expectations of our reading volunteers in the future.
- Make sure you dress appropriately for your sessions (including wearing your Read With Me lanyard) – we want you to remain comfortable whilst following school dress codes.
- As a Read With Me volunteer you are representing the Read With Me brand – we ask that you do so in a positive manner and act according to our values.
- If a child discloses something to you that raises **concerns** about their **safety** or **well-being**, please report the issue **immediately** to the **Designated Safeguarding Lead** within your school and inform the **Volunteer Liaison Manager** as detailed in our **Safeguarding Children policy** we'll take it from there.

### The serious bits

It's important to us that volunteering is **accessible to everyone**, so we have made sure that we can deliver our courses in alternative formats, depending on **your needs**. Although you may be feeling overwhelmed with information about forms and courses, we promise **it is worth it!** Our **Volunteer Liaison Manager** and **Training Manager** will be on hand to help throughout the process.



We also run after-school sessions as well as **Rhyme With Me** sessions for younger children. We offer **free books** at all of our events to anyone who would like them, provide resources and materials for activities and so much more. We would not be able to offer these services without the help of our **wonderful volunteers.**

- Want to help us run one of our **fundraising events?** We always need volunteers on the day to help with set-up and logistics.
- Could you organise your own fundraising event? A sponsored run, a music night, or even a pub quiz the sky is the limit!

• Spread the word about what we do – we'll even provide you with posters and leaflets to leave a lasting impression!
